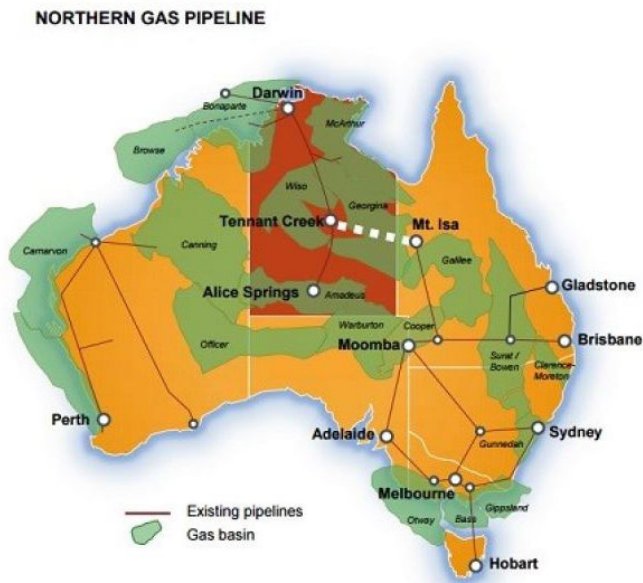


MOBILISATION PHILLIP CREEK VILLAGE, NT | OCTOBER 2017

PHILLIP CREEK COMPRESSOR STATION (PCCS)

Morris has successfully mobilised Phillip Creek Village in the Northern Territory after being awarded the **Camp Operations Tender** by Civec in September 2017. The village will support Jemina's Northern Gas Pipeline (NGP) Project, specifically the Phillip Creek Compressor Station (PCCS).

The 622km pipeline will link Tennant Creek in the Territory to Mount Isa in Queensland, unlocking the next phase of economic growth for the Territory and help build a stronger Northern Australia. Construction of the \$800 million Project began in July 2017. The first gas is scheduled to flow in late 2018.

The 200-room village is equal distance from the east coast of Australia as it is from the west and approximately 50 km north of Tennant Creek.

Morris Mobilisation Manager, Christine Cavanagh says, ***"This site is smack bang in the middle of Australia making it one of the most remote locations I have ever been to - let alone mobilised."***



Allison Roach Corporate HSEQ of Morris was onsite for the mobilisation and says; ***"The location of this village presents a lot of challenges, the safe transportation of our staff to and from work being an important one. Alice Springs airport is 6.5 hours drive away and although communications are being set up now; during the mobilization phase, there were none at all - this posed potential emergency response challenges which we had to overcome."***

Being remote doesn't mean residents will go without. A swimming pool is planned to be installed shortly and guests can enjoy delicious steak, cooked to order for dinner with barista style coffee coming soon!
